

Here is your FREE Log Briquette Sample Pack, Compliments of the Wood Fuel Co-operative

Your free Briquette Sample Pack is suitable for an open fire or wood stove and contains:

2 x Waxling firelighters (an eco-friendly firelighter)

2 x EziLite paper briquettes (quicker, easier, cleaner and hotter than kindling)

3 x SWF sawdust briquettes (to help produce a long lasting and hot ember bed)

1 x Verdo wood briquette (which is our mainstream replacement for dry logs)

1 x Celsico bark briquette (which is a long burn briquette with an attractive flame)



Follow these instructions for a quick, clean, economic and effective briquette experience:

1. Ensure you have a clean base for your fire, and a clean chimney! Fully open fire draft controls
2. Place one white paper briquette and three beige sawdust briquette on their flat ends, in a square, ensuring a space of about 10mm between briquettes to give a good air flow.
3. Place the Waxling firelighter on its end in the middle of your square of briquettes.
4. Light the Waxling firelighter.
5. Place the remaining white paper briquette at an angle on top of the lit Waxling
6. After about 20 minutes you will have a good hot base on which to set one half of the long Verdo briquette (they break in half easily with a solid tap against a hard object).
7. To keep your fire hot and lively break the big dark coloured bark briquette in two and feed onto the fire as required. Give the briquettes a little time to gather heat, don't put on more than one half at a time until you get the feel of how they perform. They will burn hotter and longer than logs.

Caution: do not over-stock your fire. These briquettes burn long and hot. Do not bank up your fire as you might do with damp logs. Adjust the stove air vents to ensure a steady flickering flame.

Different types of briquette have different burning characteristics. Experiment on your own stove/fire to find out which ones suit you best.

Caution: All fires and flues are different and they behave differently with changing weather patterns, eg. strong winds, no wind etc. These guidelines for lighting your fire are just that, general guidelines, not definitive instructions. Quantities and timelines may differ depending on your particular fire and the prevailing weather conditions. Proceed with care and, most importantly, ensure your chimney is clean and do not over fill your fire or stove. Many people find that mixing briquettes with their logs helps to create a hotter, more efficient burn.
